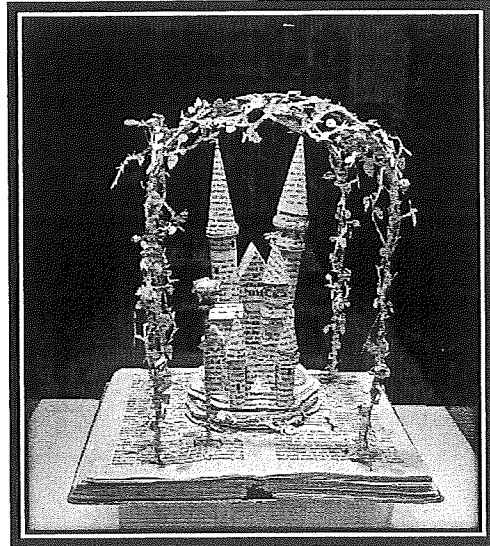


Intro to 3-D Design

Over the course of this school year we will be exploring many of the different possibilities involved in the making of three-dimensional artwork. 3-D refers to any work of art that sculptural in nature. Painting and drawing are flat while sculpture has shape and form. Students will explore many different mediums which may or may not include:

- Jewelry design: Polymer clay, wire - copper and brass sheet metal, beads, soldering metal
- Paper Mache
- Altered Book Sculptures
- Art using recycled materials (cardboard)
- Plaster Sculpture
- Clay
- 3-D Collage
- Cardboard/Paper Sculpture
- Fiber Arts



SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- A pencil case or Tupperware bin. (For when we do small projects like jewelry)
- 3 Zip Lock bags (small snack or sandwich size)
- 1 roll of masking tape
- 1 or 2 Black Sharpie Markers
- A lock for art room locker (not mandatory but recommended and I need the key/combo)

Class Expectations:

Many of you probably do not have a lot of experience working with metal to make jewelry and sculpture. We will start the year off with the basics so that you get used to working with the materials. I understand that my students have a wide range of ability. Some of you come into this class with a lot of skill and talent and others are just curious about the class. That is OK. This is an intro class and is suited to the beginning student. However, whatever your ability level, you will be expected to perform to the highest levels of your abilities.

Grading:

- **Craftsmanship** – The quality of work produced. Is it neat and clean? Are your edges sanded and even? Doesn't look sloppy or rushed, but well crafted
- **Late work** - When the student has worked diligently and shown responsibility by coming in during lunch or after school to finish a project, full credit will be given within a one-week period.

The assignment will be marked down accordingly due to reason and the amount of time that it is late.

An additional or alternative assignment may be given to receive credit for missing work. Please notify the teacher if there are any extenuating circumstances behind late or missing work. If additional help or time is needed PLEASE let me know. Like the rest of your teachers, it is my goal to help you succeed.
