

Shrinky Dink Jewelry



Assignment 1: To create a pair of earrings or a pin that represents the Design Principle **ALTERNATION**.

Assignment 2: To create a pair of earrings or a pin that represents the Design Principle: **BALANCE**.

-ONE OF THE TWO PIECES MUST HAVE 2 PARTS/LAYERS OF PLASTIC OR ADDED BEADS-

Assignment 3: Free Choice! You may have fun with this one. It is OK to trace some things and use the Internet if you want to. This can become any kind of jewelry or a magnet.

ALTERNATION: To alternate. Not gradual change but abrupt change. Think of an alternating pattern (example – black, white, black white – OR – big/small, round/square.)

BALANCE: In symmetrical balance, if an imaginary line is drawn through the center of the work, both sides are exactly the same



FOR THIS ASSIGNMENT YOU MUST USE YOUR **ENTIRE SHEET OF SHRINKY DINK PAPER**. IF YOU ONLY USE A SMALL PORTION OF THE PAPER FOR THE ALTERNATION ASSIGNMENT, YOU MUST STILL USE THE REST OF THE PAPER FOR WHATEVER FUN YOU WANT.

* You may create a pendant, earrings, a key chain, or a pin. But somehow you must show evidence of ALTERNATION or BALANCE.

Remember, this stuff shrinks. 😊 So plan large, knowing it will shrink. You should also add holes to your paper BEFORE you design and shrink your paper.

You may also choose to look up patterns or images that you wish to draw.

Before starting you must first draw your idea on paper. This drawing is worth 25 points and should be drawn well. If you can't draw it well on paper, I won't give you the shrinky dink paper for the project.

25 points – Sketches

25 Points – Alternation Jewelry

25 points – Balance Jewelry

25 Points – Choice project
